- Contribute to improve knowledge on genome-to-phenome relationship accounting for both genetic and non-genetic mechanisms controlling traits.

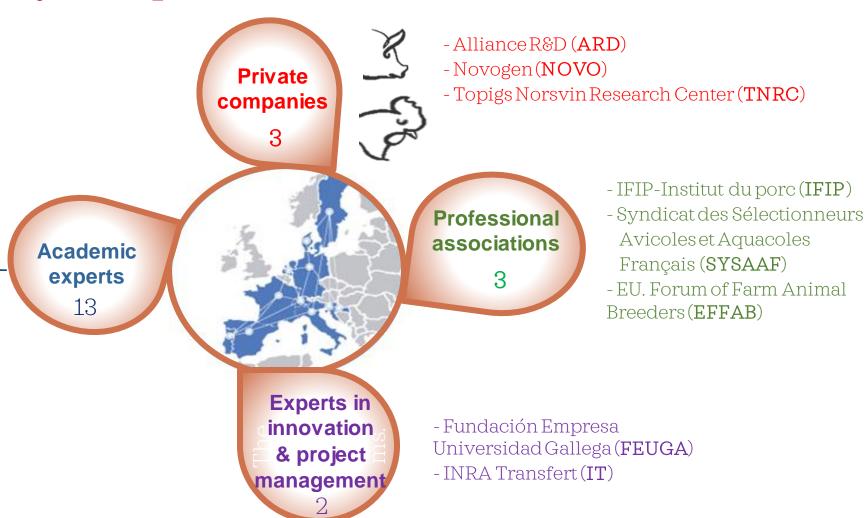

After 2 years, we have accumulated a large number of animals/samples/omics data

Pipelines used in GEroNIMO



Pipelines from nfCore when they are available

"nf-core/rnaseq" for RNAseq analysis "nf-core/methylseq » for bisulfite

- > In-house pipelines combined with pipelines already approved by others
 - in-house pipeline (Uppsala University) for GBS-MeDIP analysis
 - TensorQTL (from broad Institute) for GWAS with gene expression
 - phaser (from Stephen Castel) for Allele Specific Expression

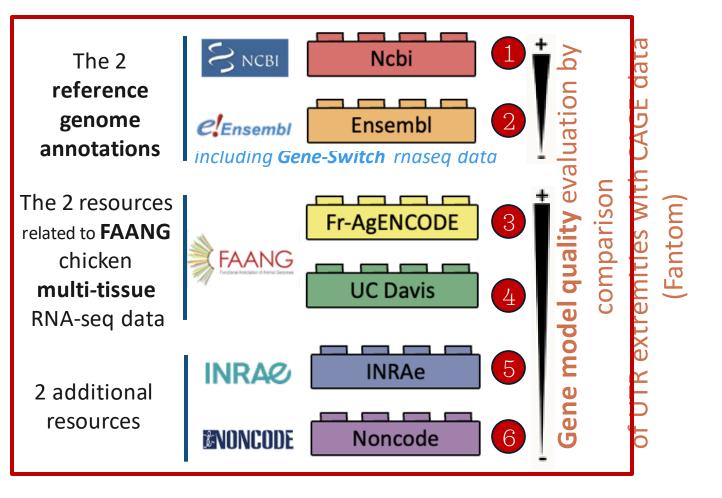

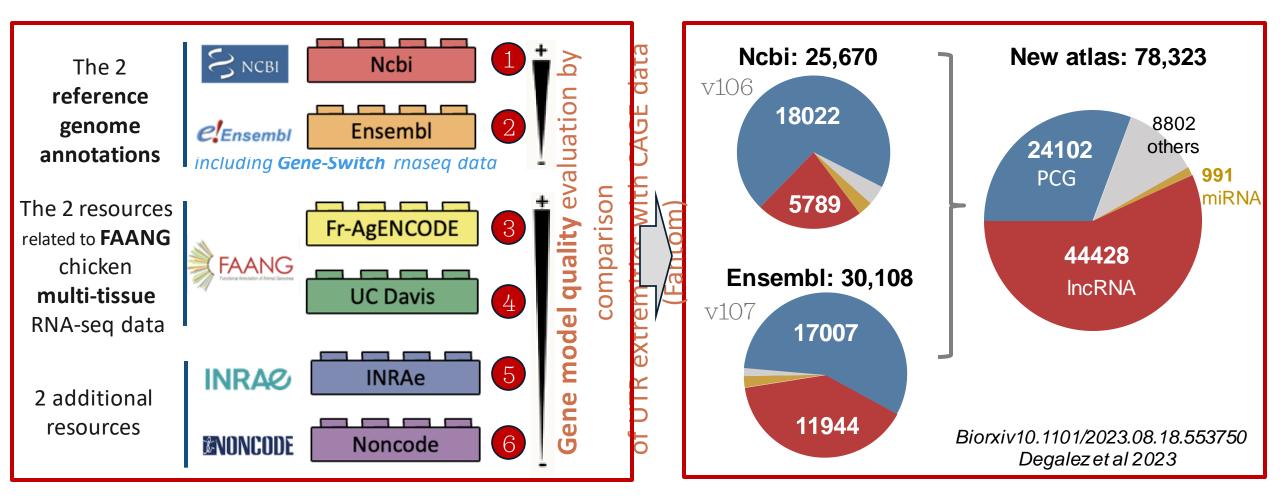
We successively gathered 6 gene model resources





We successively gathered 6 gene model resources

⇒ Using this strategy, we increased the number of Protein-Coding Genes (PCG) to 24,000 & the number of lncRNA to 44,000



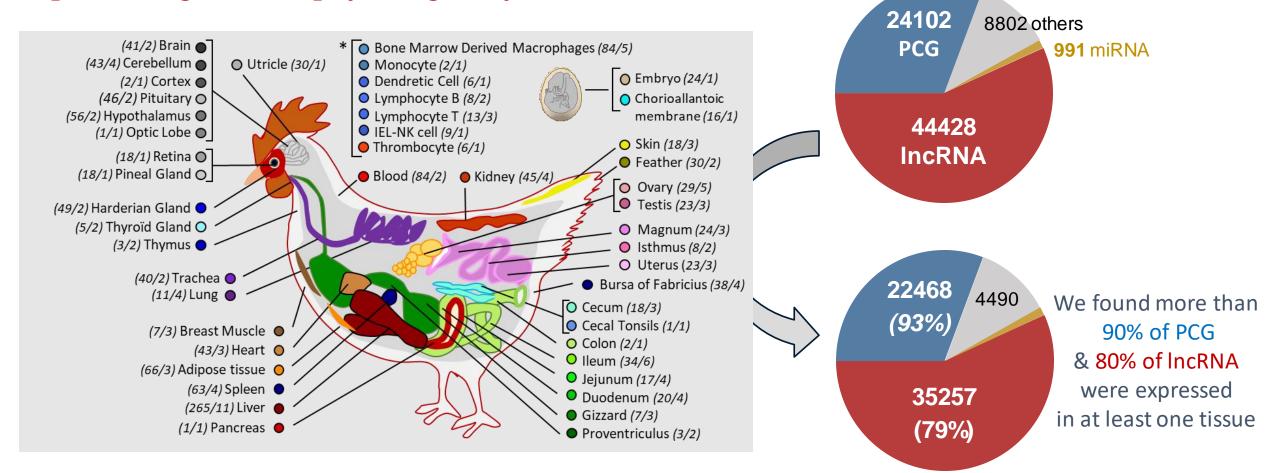
For each gene locus, we can get the gene occurrence in the 6 databases and their ID equivalence between NCBI



We tested the reliability of these gene models by quantifying their expression across 47 tissues



=> We analyzed 1400RNAseq samples from 36 datasets representing the main physiological systems for chickens

⇒ Prioritize the genes expressed in a tissue that is consistent with the trait of interest

With the possibility to display Graphical Views

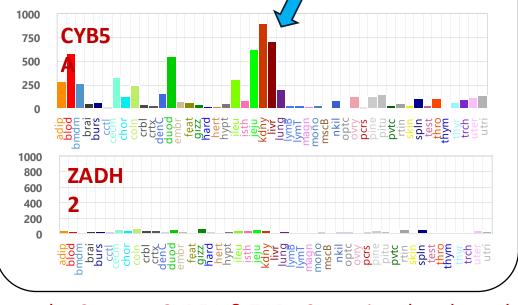

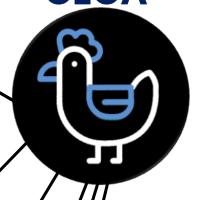

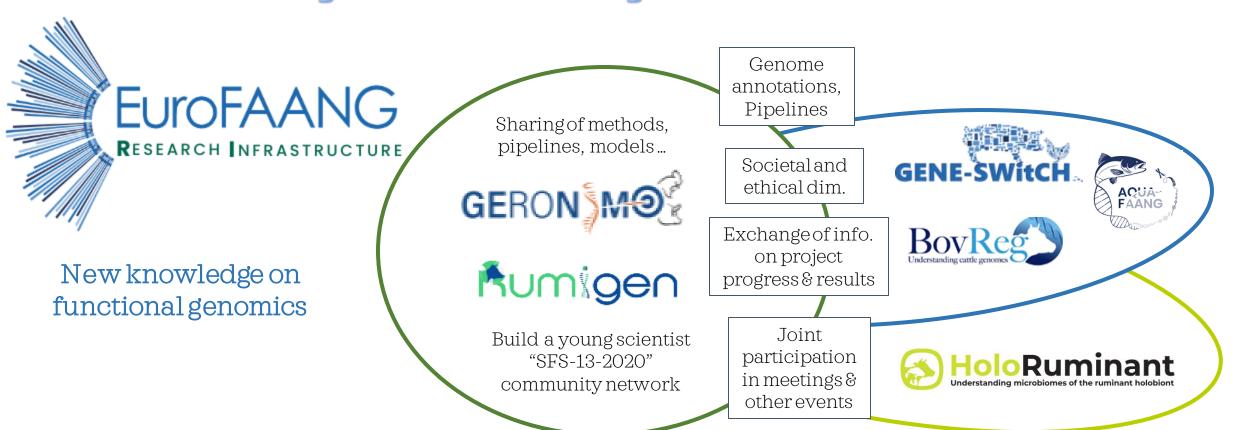
